100+ Women Who Care is for every woman who desires to directly support local charitable organizations. We keep the methodology simple and easy. All 100+ WWC members/teams make a pledge to donate \$100 four times a year. At each of the quarterly meetings members nominate charities, three are chosen at random, and after a brief presentation, the members vote on which charity to support. Once the winning charity is announced, everyone writes a \$100 check, on the spot directly to that charity. All charities nominated must be located in, and serve Will County and must have 501(c)(3) non-profit status.

Member Jackie Traynere said, "The Exchange Club of North Will County will put these dollars to good use with the teacher grants and especially with seniors who have been isolated at our nursing homes and assisted living facilities. Helping these communities during the pandemic has been a big priority and the donation from 100+ Women Who Care will make a difference in so many lives."
